

Key Findings - Socio-economic analysis

- Declining population leading to fewer people of working age. Natural resources need to be used sustainably
- Strong key industries create jobs directly as well as through the need for skills and support structures
- Differences in language and culture make cooperation challenging
- MSME and start-ups are the key to a green transition, decent jobs and prosperous communities
- The twin transition to a sustainable & digital economy is fundamental for the Aurora region

- Major challenges include infrastructure and connectivity, unlocking the full potential of natural resources and human capital as well as attracting a competent labour force
- The rich variety of geography, local economies and culture provides opportunities for joint trans-regional learning and new cross-border initiatives
- Climate change, green transition and sustainable use of natural resources, including new international initiatives are highly prioritized in Aurora
- Recovery from COVID-19 as well as building up resilience for potential future shocks needs to be given extra attention

National co-funding – What changes?

- Regional Council of Lapland (Aurora and NPA) and Helsinki-Uusimaa Regional Council (BSR) make the co-funding decisions and administer the payment applications
- No more pre-commitments towards the programmes
- Application submission only after the EU funding decision (within 4 months of the official decision)
- One application on behalf of all Finnish project partners
- National co-funding can be up to 70% of the non-EU portion of the budget 4 900€ and max 200 000€ per project








Example for NPA and Aurora:

The total budget of the Finnish partners 500 000 €



70 % national co-funding 30% other (own, private etc funding)

National co-funding:

175 000 € x 70% = **122 500** €

Other funding:

175 000 € x 30% = 52 500 €





Co-financing practises in Sweden?

- Each participating region responsible their own co-financing. Regional differences in the practicalities, timelines and rules.
 - Region Norrbotten
 - Region Västerbotten
 - Region Västernorrland
- Regional co-financing only for the budget portion of the Swedish partners.
- Partners are encouraged to contact the regional contact points already during the project preparation phase.
- Region <u>Norrbotten</u>: The same application deadlines as the Interreg programmes, platform used: minaansokan.se.
- Region <u>Västerbotten</u>: continuous calls for financing under 500 000 SEK (app. 6 week processing times), additionally few application rounds per year.
- Region <u>Västernorrland</u>: continuous calls, <u>stina.nilsson@rvn.se</u>








Co-financing practises in Norway?

- Partners from North Norway (Nordland, Troms & Finnmark and the Sapmi area) may seek regional co-financing.
- Regional co-financing only for the budget portion of the Norwegian partners.
- Partners should seek co-funding also from other regional actors like Innovation Norge or entreprise developers.
- Co-funding up to 20% of the budget.
- Application deadlines similar to the Interreg programmes

- Finland moves to centralised model, no more private auditors.
